The 2012 Sustainable Design Project: Lithonia Woman's Club

This year, the Outreach Committee for the Red and Green Scene will once again gather to give back to the community in a collaborative manner. The Committee has elected to work on a project for the good of the citizens of Lithonia by adopting Lithonia's historic Women's Club as its 2012 service project. Built in the late 1920s with locally mined granite, the building served as Dekalb County's first library and is currently owned by the Arabia Mountain Heritage Area Alliance and a part of the Georgia Conservancy's Blueprints for Successful Communities Program. In its 14 years, Blueprints has conducted 23 community-based planning programs. The project will include a detailed evaluation of the building and the development of a strategy to upgrade the building for public use.
